# **Tie-Dye Pattern Creation**

This playbook provides a step-by-step guide to creating various tie-dye patterns on fabric. It covers the essential steps from prepping materials to applying dye and setting the color, resulting in colorful and unique fabric designs.

#### Step 1: Preparation

Gather all necessary materials including fabric, rubber bands, dyes, gloves, and plastic bags. Prepare your workspace by covering it with plastic or newspaper.

#### **Color Combinations**

Wear protective gloves when working with dyes to protect your skin, and work in a well-ventilated area or wear a mask if recommended by dye instructions.

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
