

Implementing Neighborhood Watch

This playbook describes the sequential steps necessary to establish a Neighborhood Watch Program aimed at enhancing local security through community vigilance and cooperation.

Step 1: **Community Meeting**

Organize an initial community meeting to gauge interest and discuss the benefits of a Neighborhood Watch Program. Invite local law enforcement to speak about crime prevention and the importance of community involvement.

Step 2: **Establish Committee**

Form a planning committee comprised of interested volunteers to oversee the establishment of the program and coordinate with local law enforcement.

General Notes

Police Liaison
