

Accessible Online Course Design

Step 1: **Assessment**

Step 8: **Training & Support**

Provide training for educators and support staff on how to create and maintain accessible online learning environments and troubleshoot potential issues.

Step 9: **Ongoing Evaluation**

Establish a process for the ongoing evaluation of course accessibility. Regularly update materials and practices to accommodate new standards and technologies.
